### Legal Issues That Affect Parents And Teens:

- If alcohol is served to minors, including your own child, on your property or in your home, serious consequences can result. **Should this take place in your absence, with or without your permission, the consequences are the same.** PENALTY: Possible community service, fine up to \$1,000 **and** charge of contributing to the delinquency of a minor with a fine of \$2,500 and up to one year in jail, plus five years of probation.
- If a minor has consumed alcohol or drugs on your property (with or without parents knowledge or permission), and someone is injured or injures someone else, either while on your property or after leaving, you will face a minimum of 6 months or up to one year in jail. Possible criminal and civil penalties also may be added.

### Laws and Legal Issues for Minors In California:

- It is illegal to use a fake ID to purchase alcohol. It is a misdemeanor punishable by a one year suspension of a driver's license.
- A license may be refused to a teen if he or she has a history of alcohol or drug abuse or has used a license illegally.
- Maximum blood alcohol content (BAC) for drivers under the age of 21 is 0.01 percent.
- There is a strict Zero Tolerance law for drivers under 21. If a driver under 21 has a BAC of 0.01% or higher their license may be suspended or revoked for one year for a first time offender and up to 3 years for three or more offenses within 10 years.
- A minor who is convicted of a drug or alcohol-related offense (Minor in Possession) will face a one-year license suspension, even if no driving was involved in the offense.
- DUI convictions will stay on a driver's record for 10 years, affecting insurance premiums for that entire time.

### Raising Awareness for Impaired Driving:

Vehicle crashes are the number one cause of deaths among teens, with the primary collision factor being alcohol. Driving under the influence is dangerous for everyone, especially teenagers. Arrive Alive California, Inc. brings reality-based DUI prevention programs to California schools in order to create awareness that teen impaired driving is a real problem that affects real lives.
